The FJDC Story

With intimation to the Federal and Provincial Ministries of Health, the PMDC and the University of Karachi and after necessary documentation, Fatima Jinnah Dental College was born on the map of Pakistan. It is a pioneer institution devoted to the teaching of dentistry, independently and not as a department of any medical college. The College is named "Fatima Jinnah Dental College" to pay respect and homage to the memory of Late Mohtarma Fatima Jinnah, who was herself, a Dentist. The Mohtarma, sister of Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah, qualified as a dentist in early part of this century in 1922, in undivided India. Due to her devotion to the cause of creation of Pakistan, she sacrificed her professional & personal life. She was honored by the title of "Madar-e-Millat" (Mother of the Nation), by which name she is still fondly remembered. The establishment of this College is also the fulfillment of the promise made to Late Miss Fatima Jinnah by Dr. S. Bagar Askary, the Chairman, and founder of this College, in 1964, when he was president of Student's Union, Dow Medical College and president National Student Federation (NSF), during the Mohtarma's struggle for democracy. It took a long time, but by the Grace of ALLAH, the dream is a reality today. This college was established in the University of Karachi academic year 1992-93. It is significant, that 1993 was the centenary year of the birth of the Mohtarma and the establishment of this College was a gift to the Nation on this auspicious occasion.

Difficulties Surmounted

Besides, a sizeable number of qualified students are also to be attracted to compete for admission in the College. Assemblage of such financial, physical and human resources is a great challenge. Particularly collection of highly qualified and experienced faculty, of which there is acute shortage in Pakistan and its retention by providing them attractive pay package and career structure, pose formidable problems. Besides, procurement of hospital equipment, dental chairs and professional books and journals is a very expensive proposition. Only sponsors of un-impeachable character who have sound credentials and antecedents and who have earned a vast reservoir of credibility because of their outstanding contribution in different walks of life, particularly in education and medicine, with continuous hard work and dedication, can hope to acquire success in fulfilling the above mentioned requirements. Such ventures require sound and meticulous financial and administrative planning to create required facilities and to continuously improve, upgrade and update them. It is imperative for the college to develop vital linkage with the medical, dental and educational establishments and society at large, on whom the college depends for persistent support and resources, vital for its continued existence, growth and development. In conclusion, it would suffice to say that the establishment of a dental college in a developing country, is an arduous and complex process, requiring highest degree of contribution and enthusiastic co-operation on the part of all those who happen to be associated with it, in the capacity of sponsors, administrators, teachers, students, parents and other relevant segments of society. And when requisite level of support is forthcoming from such diverse elements the efforts to establish a dental college is destined to be crowned with success.

The Success story of the establishment of Fatima Jinnah Dental College has been kept alive and continues to progress by constant struggle to keep abreast of ever changing criteria and requirements imposed abruptly, by the wranglings of the various authorities having power over such institutions. FJDC is today a shining star, with torch alight and the flag flying, for the onward march.



many other prestigious dental colleges and universities.







Affiliating FJDC is a complement for JSMU as it is a pioneer institution of dentistry and has contributed immensely in raising the standard of dentistry in the country.






Fatima Jinnah Dental College has acted as a beacon of light for those who followed later on. There are a total of 33 dental institutions functioning in the country today."











1st Professional BDS Subjects Anatomy

Science of Anatomy deals with the structure of human body. The first year BDS program requires this as an essential subject, because without proper knowledge of the anatomical structures, it is impossible to understand how the organs function and the body movements take place. The department consists of a highly skilled and trained faculty. The science of Anatomy has subdivisions of Histology, Embryology, Gross Anatomy and Neuroanatomy. The students are taught detailed functional anatomy of Human Head and Neck including the nervous system, embryo development of important organs and the structural architecture of cells and tissues at microscopic level. By the end of the session it is expected that a strong relevant anatomical foundation is laid. Students will have access to microscopes, dissected models and specimens, histological specimens, embryology models, overhead projectors and IT equipment. There is a separate Anatomy museum which has a vast display of anatomical structures, 3D models and a large collection of skulls and bones. The study of anatomy with special emphasis on clinical aspects enable students to develop the basic core of human anatomy in relation to problem based learning.





Biochemistry

The Department of Biochemistry is a wonderland for anyone who loves to work with chemicals and carry out experiments. The department has well trained faculty members who demonstrate the working of different chemicals, their biological effects and interactions between biological and chemical elements. The basic aim is to provide a thorough understanding of the core principles and topics of Biochemistry and their experimental basis, and to enable students to acquire a specialized knowledge and understanding of selected aspects by means of a lecture series and research projects. Biochemistry depart-ment has a well equipped laboratory, it has chemical reagents and equipment necessary to teach students to perform various laboratory investigations needed to confirm diagnosis of various diseases. This includes teaching sessions and supervised practical groups imparting training for hematology, nerve and muscle, cardiovascular systems and special senses. Structured modules for each topic including practicals, problem based learning, video lectures and journal clubs ensures maximum student participation.

Physiology

Physiology is the study of how the body works. The systems of the body including the cardiovascular, respiratory, neural, renal, endocrine, gastrointestinal and reproductive systems are examined using approaches ranging from molecular and cellular to whole organism levels.

The Department of Physiology is one of the most well equipped departments in the college. It provides modern facilities and uses latest approaches and techniques to teach the 1st year BDS students all the topics that are in the syllabus. The laboratory is equipped with various instruments including electronic microscopes to carry out physiology experiments. Tutorials are conducted and demonstrations are carried out on regular basis. The department has a complete resource center with many video lectures, CDs, DVDs, posters, books and multimedia facilities.





Oral Biology

The subject of Oral biology has three major areas: Tooth morphology, Oral Histology and Oral Embryology. The students gain knowledge about the structure and development of tooth and its surrounding structures. Dentists apply this understanding for the diagnosis of various conditions associated with oral hard and soft tissue abnormalities. Students study oral histological slides under electronic microscope, and with the aid of 3D models of the tooth and mouth structure. Highly sophisticated equipment is used for tooth sectioning which enables microscopic details to be studied.

FIDC



Pharmacology is the branch of science which deals with the study of drugs and their interaction with the human body. This subject is taught in the 2nd year of BDS Professional studies. The academic staff share a commitment to top-quality teaching which emphasizes general principles and integrates into it the latest findings of modern research.

The course covers the drug groups that are a part of the syllabus set by HEC / PMDC and the University of Karachi. It comprises of pharmacokinetics, pharmacodynamics, general pharmacology, mechanism of actions of different drugs, their interaction and adverse affects on the human body.

The practical work is carried out under the supervision of trained and skilled demonstrators. Each experiment is first discussed and demonstrated and then students



are asked to carry out the drug preparations themselves. The department provides ample facilities to carry out the experiments. The lab work is then charted in a lab journal. Weekly discussions, tutorials and presentations are conducted by the department to promote student participation and one on one interaction. Visits to drug manufacturers / pharmaceutical companies is an essential part of the teaching and training program and gives a first hand knowledge of production of branded medicines.

Dental Materials



Science of Dental Materials is one of the many required courses in the Bachelor of Dental Surgery (BDS) Program. It is important to understand the fundamental properties, composition, chemistry of dental product, behavior of dental materials in the delivery of quality patient care. A dentist must understand why specific materials behave as they do and why they are used for certain application in certain locations to treat the oral-dental diseases. Therefore, undergraduate dental students studying Science of Dental Materials will gain knowledge to understand the scope of dental materials' structure and properties relationship, careful manipulation and clinical correlation of dental materials. Students will learn how to use various materials like waxes, wires, acrylic to make dentures, and use silver mercury, composites and other such materials for various dental treat-ments. The dental material laboratory of FJDC is an exceptional setup which has been used as an example by other institutes. The students will also work on high-tech phantom heads, which simulate the real oral cavity, complete with mouth and teeth, on which students can horn their skills.



Pathology

The subject of pathology is the science which deals with the study and diagnosis of diseases afflicting the normal healthy cells. The department of pathology has separated the subject into three main categories: General pathology, Special pathology and Microbiology. The division of the subject helps to focus more on each area. Separate labs/experiments and tutorials are conducted for each division. The students are taught the subject thoroughly putting more focus on general pathology and microbiology.

Pathology is an exciting discipline because it transcends the traditional boundaries between basic and clinical sciences. With advances in molecular biology, the completion of the human genome project, and develop-ment of sophisticated technology such as next generation sequencing and proteomics. We are poised to understand the pathogenesis of human diseases at the molecular level.



Community Dentistry



Community dentistry is a subject taught by the department of Public Health. Oral health problems are a major health dilemma in our society. This is mostly due to lack of oral health awareness amongst the population especially those with low socio-economic status. The goal of this dental specialty is to increase oral health awareness in our society thereby preventing the occurrence of such problems.

The department works alongside the Ministry of Health, NGOs like SOS Village, Salvation Army, World Health Organization (WHO) and others. Various aspects of research are also taught to the students. Students also enjoy visits to various health related industries. Many projects are conducted here by various international universities. The students are made to visit different schools,

communities and public places where they provide free dental checkup to the patients and demonstrate preventive procedures. Creating health awareness and educating the masses is carried out to control the curative burden on a limited health allocation in the national budget.

Clinical Campus

The clinical campus comprises of two separate buildings facing each other on 100 Foot Road, Azam Town, adjacent to Phase I, Defence Housing Authority. Here the clinical dental teaching and training is undertaken with great enthusiasm and the students are exposed to a large number of cases on a daily basis. The adjoining localities makeup a very healthy catchment

area, where the hospital is within easy reach for over two million people. This strategic location together with the excellent reputation, spanning over 32 years of clinical care, make it a top dental training centre in Pakistan. The other building is the recently developed Azam Town General Hospital, which has been specially geared up for the teaching of general medicine and general surgery to the third professional BDS students. This facility is for the training and teaching of BDS students alone and not to be shared by MBBS students. The exposure to medical and surgical cases is maximized. This unique advantage ensures highest standard of unmatched education, clinical teaching and training.







3rd Professional BDS Clinical Subjects

Periodontology

The department of Periodontology provides periodontal care to the community, where diseases of the gums and the related soft tissues are diagnosed and treated accordingly. Students are taught the basics of periodontology, learning how to prevent, diagnose and treat periodontal problems of all types. Students are also exposed to a variety of oral problems, and carry out treatment like dental scaling and polishing, deep curettage, root planing and perio surgeries. The department has a large flow of patients and provides optimal, comprehensive periodontal care for the highly diverse population, with rigorous quality assurance and patient satisfaction.



Oral Medicine

The department of oral medicine deals with patient care, teaching and research involving diagnosis and non-surgical management of diseases of the orofacial complex and systemic and behavioral disorders that impact oral health, including: Orofacial pain, temporomandibular disorders (TMD), Mucosal diseases, Oral cancer and complications of cancer therapy, Dental care for patients with disabilities, Salivary dysfunction, Oral complications of systemic illnesses, Craniofacial imaging and other diagnostics and dental emergency care. Management of any condition or lesion includes careful diagnosis by means of radiographs, biopsies and blood tests, leading to its definitive treatment.



Oral Pathology

These Departments are concerned with the evaluation of patient's oral health condition. The primary mission of this department is to provide supervised training to the students on the complete history taking of the patient and performing thorough oral and extra oral examination. On the basis of these records a definitive or differential diagnosis is reached and a proper treatment plan is designed for each patient. The department is equipped with necessary examination instruments and special X-Ray machines to aid in diagnostic procedures. The hospital has installed digital imaging X-Ray machines, where patient's radiographs can be viewed on the computer via internet.

General Surgery & General Medicine

The dental students have to undergo teaching and training in overall concepts of medicine and surgery. The curriculum covers in detail the domains having relevance to the practice of dentistry. FJDC gives great importance to this portion of the course which consumes the major portion of the 3rd year, as this is the only opportunity a dentist would have, throughout their career, to study general medicine and general surgery.

Fatima Jinnah Dental Hospital, has settings for patients presenting with systemic diseases and medical / surgical problems. The primary objective of the faculty is to educate students about expert diagnosis and management of human illness based on the knowledge and preclinical experience. Students of third year are expected to study various health related diseases. They are taught patient management through lectures, history taking, physical examination, laboratory and radiology investigations. This exercise enables them to achieve differential diagnosis and treatment plan for continued evaluation and therapy. Special emphasis is given to endocrinology and blood diseases.

Dental students are made aware of the basic surgical skills and principles. Clinical teaching is provided to students in both general and special surgical areas such as infection, asepsis, tumors, hernia, etc. The students are exp-osed to a variety of surgical problems where they are expected to check for patient's clinical signs and symptoms under supervision. Occasionally students are introduced to operation theater surroundings to observe sterilizing procedures and operations.

An MoU has been signed between FJDC and Chiniot General Hospital (CGH). This collaboration will enable FJDC's 3rd-year BDS students to gain invaluable clinical exposure and training opportunities within the well-equipped facilities of CGH. This hands-on experience will not only enrich their education but also prepare them for future healthcare challenges.



4th Professional BDS Subjects Conservative (Operative) Dentistry

This department of FJDC is the pride of the entire dental community. The department is the hub of knowledge and clinical training. Since the establishment of the college, it has been known to be the strongest restorative department in the country. The faculty of this specialty travel all over the world to share their researches and demonstrate clinical skills. The post-graduation programs including FCPS, MCPS has produced over 20 post graduates, who are all holding leading positions in dental institutions. The department also provides training in advance dental practice to general practitioners via workshops and clinical attachments. Students learn treatment like dental filling, RCT procedures and other restorative procedures. The department of restorative dentistry includes the operative and endodontic procedures for the restoration of missing or lost tooth structure. It has the responsibility of basic clinical training of the students and house officers / residents. The post graduation component provides advanced clinical training for the FCPS and MCPS program. Students from 3rd year onwards are given exposure to patients coming in for treatment. The mission of this



department is to provide proper patient care through advanced procedures. This is accomplished in two ways 1) All the procedures are performed under super-vision and 2) materials such as amalgam, composites, GIC, and fluoride are manipulated using modern and effective techniques. The residents are trained on both manual and rotary endodontic procedures, to keep them up to date with current practice in the various clinical settings.



Orthodontics

The department has a reputation of being dedicated to excellence. The faculty and staff are committed to upholding and enhancing that tradition. The Orthodontics treatment of FJDC attracts patients from all over the city as it is trusted for providing removal and fixed braces and related treatment of international standards on cost to cost basis. Since its inception it has been engaged in teaching, patient care and research.

The curriculum consists of subject matter that has direct application in orthodontic practice. Examples are orthodontic topics covering etiology, diagnosis, and treatment planning; applied clinical orthodontics and dentofacial orthopedics; cephalometrics, and other auxiliary imaging methods; bio-mechanical principles; anatomy; growth and development; surgical orthodontics; craniofacial anomalies; embryology; biostatistics; metallurgy of orthodontic materials etc. Aesthetic cosmetic and reformative dentistry is what orthodontics is all about. It moves mountains to change faces.



Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery

The department of oral and maxillofacial surgery at Fatima Jinnah Dental College and Hospital aims at teaching and training students and residents to perfection in this field. This is accomplished by patient care and emergency services. Training under supervision encompasses the areas of scientific research, dento alveolar surgery, maxillo-facial trauma management, maxillofacial pathology, reconstructive procedures, local and general anesthesia and sedation. Prescription writing with proper dosages of analgesics and antibiotics with their indications and contra-indications are also taught to the students. The department has recently been revamped, increasing and improving the facilities with the addition of new surgical area and dedicated operational theaters to meet the surgical needs of the increasing patient pool.



Prosthodontics

It is one of the major departments in the hospital with large number of patients benefitting from skilled personal and at affordable rates. Within the field of dentistry, considerable significance is attached to dental prosthetics. It includes partial and complete dentures,



crowns, bridges, implants and implant related dentures. The curriculum is structured to deliver information through lectures, seminars, and clinical overview of patient care. We continually review new material and associated techniques to assure appropriately researched new technologies and their incorporation into the training program, while at the same time, using evidence based information which is the core for our teaching procedure. The department is responsible for educating students to be competent in treatment and management of patients who require comprehensive diagnosis, treatment plan and sequence of treatment in general prosthodontic therapy, commonly found in general dental practice. This department is extensively involved in the following areas: The curriculum is centered in biologic diseases, treatment modalities in prosthodontics which include (fixed, removable partial denture, complete denture, implant prosthodontics and esthetic dentistry) and its delivery, within the limitation of available biomaterial support and patient management. It stimulates

students to apply knowledge gained from courses for preclinical problem solving during their preclinical studies as well as clinical problem solving throughout their clinical junior and senior years. Correlation between knowledge gained in different departments is the key to success in prosthodontics.


Post Graduate Training Programs

On the establishment of FJDC in 1992, it was realized that there was no worthwhile and effective postgraduate program for dentistry in Pakistan. The five public sector dental colleges functional at that time, were grossly deficient and lacked adequately qualified and sufficiently experienced faculty to supervise postgraduate candidates.

FJDC in 1993 sponsored the Royal College of England to run courses and hold FDS RCS Part I examination in Karachi, in Collaboration with the British Council. This was the first time the Royal College extended these facilities outside U.K.

The Royal College team consisting of Dr. Johan Rayne, Dr. Roger Linden, Dr. B.K.B. Berkovitz and Dr. D.A. Luke, conducted a two month preparatory course before holding the FDS RCS Part I examination. FJDC has a standing offer from the Royal College of England to hold such exercise whenever the need is felt.

It was only then, in 1994, that the CPSP took up post-graduation in dentistry. It is heartening to note that post-graduation in dentistry has, over these years, established its self in Pakistan and sufficient faculty is being produced for its need.




